

This year, the following activities were introduced to the conference, in addition to abstract presentations, speakers, and round table session:

- 1) Breakout Room Sessions
 - Moderators led four smaller discussions on the topics of research frameworks, research mentorship and career transitions (medical school to residency & residency to fellowship and beyond)
- 2) Hands on Training Session (pictured)
 - Surgical experts led five training sessions
- Stations included: skin and soft tissue suturing, bowel anastomosis, common bile anastomosis, vascular anastomosis, and basic laparoscopic skills

There were 12 Golden Scalpel abstract presentations on various research topics. Presenters were nominated by their medical schools and represented medical schools across Canada. Winning abstract presentations were titled:

- 1) Remodeling of the pancreatic tumour micro environment with oncolytic virotherapy (Golden Scalpel);
- 2) Augmented Reality Hand-tracking: An Accessible Solution for Accurate and Reliable Remote Finger Joint Range of Motion Measurement (Silver Scalpel); and
- 3) Pro-tumour lymph node remodeling during cancer is not tumour-cell specific (Silver Scalpel).
